REPORT ON THE AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED ON $31^{\rm st}$ MARCH, 2023

1. Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Financial Statements of **SELF-RELIANT INITIATIVES THROUGH JOINT ACTION (SRIJAN)** which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2023, the statement of Income and Expenditure and Receipt and Payment Account for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information which we have signed under reference to this report.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements, read with other notes given thereto, give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- In the case of Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Trust as at 31st March 2023;
- In the case of Statement of Income and Expenditure, of the surplus for the year ended on 31st March 2023;
- In the case of Receipt and Payment account, of cash flows for the year ended on 31st March 2023.

2. Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Accounting (SAs) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountant of India. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Trust in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountant of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the Financial Statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

3. Emphasis of Matter

- a) We also draw your attention to **Item No. 3b) of Note 18** of the Financial Statements regarding grants wherein Rs. 30.5 lakhs paid to NGOs prior to 01-04-2022; but neither amount was utilized or refunded till date.
- b) We also draw your attention to **Item No. 4. c) of Note 18** of the Financial Statements regarding grants wherein overspent amount aggregating to Rs. 169.19 lakhs is recoverable as on 31-03-2023; of which Rs. 159.38 lakhs and Rs. 7.54 lakhs are outstanding for more than 2 years from Govt of MP MG NREGS CFT & Govt. of Uttar Pradesh SRLM- CFP UP respectively. In the



opinion of the Management of Srijan, these balances are good for recovery and no provision is required.

c) We also draw your attention to Item No. 4. d) of Note 18 of the Financial Statements regarding unspent balances of Rs. 384.49 lakhs are lying in 6 no. of projects even though project period have been completed for which extension approvals are pending till date.

Our opinion is not modified in this regard.

4. Responsibility of Management for the Financial Statements

The Management is responsible for the preparation of these Financial Statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and expenditure of the Trust in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including Accounting Standards, to the extent applicable, prescribed by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records for safeguarding of the assets of the Trust and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or

In preparing the Financial Statements, management is responsible for assessing the ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. The Management is responsible for overseeing the Trust's financial reporting process.

5. Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Financial Statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these Financial Statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Financial Statements, whether
 due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and
 obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The
 risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one
 resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions,

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

6. Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

- a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Trust so far as it appears from our examination of those books;
- The Balance Sheet, Statement of Income and Expenditure and Receipts & Payment Account for the year ended 31st March 2023, dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account;
- d) In our opinion, the aforesaid financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards, to the extent applicable, issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

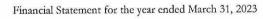

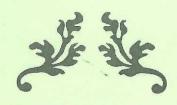

Notes to Audited Financial Statements for the Year Ended March 31, 2023 Note 18: Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to Accounts

A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

1) Background

- a. SRIJAN is registered as a Public Charitable Trust with sub-registrar, Delhi. It is also registered u/s 12A and notified under section 80G of the Income Tax Act, 1961 bearing Registration No. DIT (E) S-2600/2000/282 DT. 11.08.2000. Provisional approval is granted for 12A and 80G.Vide order dated 22/09/2021 for the Assessment Years 2022-23 to AY 2026-27 with Provisional registration number AABTS7533HE20165 and AABTS7533HF20080 respectively.
- b. The Trust is registered with FCRA authorities to receive foreign contribution for carrying its objects / activities since 9th September 2002. Renewal of registration No. 231660276 under FCRA has been done vide their letter dated 05th January 2022 which is valid for a period of five years till 31st March 2027.

2) Basis of preparation of financial statements:

a. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and on accrual basis except stated otherwise. The financial statements have been prepared to comply with the accounting standards, to the extent applicable, issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India [ICAI]. The accounting policies applied by the Trust are consistent with those used in the previous year.

3) Use of estimates:

a. The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period / year. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates.

4) Revenue / Expenditure Recognition:

a. The main income of the Trust is from Grants and Contributions from government agencies, corporates and various development institutions and individuals from Indian as well foreign agencies. All grants and contributions are recognized on receipt basis except corpus donations directly credited to Corpus Fund, but expenditure and liabilities are recognized on accrual basis. In the case of a programme undertaken with the support of some government and other agencies, though the funds received are in the nature of the program execution expenses under a contract, the same is reported as grant in view of the restriction on the expenditure and its nature as reimbursement of expenses.





- b. Interest income is recognized on a time proportion basis, taking into account the amount invested in bank deposit and the interest rate applicable. Interest income is included under the head "Other income" in the statement of income and expenditure.
- c. Interest income on fixed deposits earmarked to corpus fund is credited to corpus fund.
- d. Interest earned on the restricted project grants have been allocated as per terms & conditions of MOUs with the respective funding agencies.
- e. Dividend income from mutual funds is accrued when the right to receive payment is established by the balance sheet date, either by redemption or maturity, in the case of cumulative schemes.

5) Format of accounts:

a. Statement of Income and Expenditure has been classified based on the cost of various activities undertaken by the Trust, while natural expenses / income head wise statement of Income and Expenditure is prepared as a part of financial statements.

6) Classification of expenditures:

Various activities undertaken by the Trust, expenses incurred directly thereon for rendering of services to the poor rural communities, have been treated as under:

- a. Livelihood Promotion Activities these includes expenses related to community-based institutions created/promoted by the Trust, for providing informal training and exposure of beneficiaries / communities, capital assets created for communities, material purchased and handed over to communities, salaries and other cost related to contracted staff and Societies staff working directly with the communities on deputation.
- b. Livelihood Promotion Support- these include salaries and the related benefits, travelling, lodging and boarding for management / field project staff.
- **c.** Research and documentation includes payment for consultancy/professional charges related to projects, retreat charges, travelling, lodging and boarding, wherever incurred for the same.

7) Disbursement to NGO Partners

Grants made to NGO partners are accounted for in the year of expenditure incurred by the concerned partners for implementation of projects, awarded under grant agreement, on the basis of quarterly expenditure reports and finally settled on the basis of utilization certificates certified by an independent firms of Chartered Accountants or by the Management. At the end of project, if there is any un-utilized grants balance with partners then it shall be deducted from the next grant amount to be paid to partners for implementing of a new project.





8) Fixed assets:

- a. Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation.
- **b.** Fixed assets purchased are classified as per the nature of assets and recorded in the books from the date they are purchased and used for the objectives of the Trust.
- c. Assets created for the beneficiaries i.e. "assets in possession of the community but held and accounted for" in the books of account of the Trust, are to be ultimately transferred to them. All such assets are recognised at cost and charged to respective funding agencies as program/project expenses in consonance with the compliance of the grant conditions and the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961. As these assets are held and accounted for in the books of the Trust, and are under use by the community, depreciation at the prescribed rates has been charged in the books of the Trust from the date when these assets were purchased / put to use by credit and debit to the respective fixed assets and capital assets fund account in the Balance Sheet.

In Current situation, SRIJAN has maintained Fixed Asset register at locations keeping quantitative records for exercising control over these assets. The transfer of ownership of assets and physical possession are documented in SRIJAN records.

- **d.** Fixed Assets purchased out of grants received are expensed off as program expenditure and are also capitalised with an equal amount credited to Capital Fund. Accordingly, deletions of such fixed assets are also adjusted from the Capital Fund.
- e. Assets received as in-kind donations are recorded at value provided by donor agencies or at fair market value as on the date of acquiring such assets.
- f. Depreciation has been charged on the assets at the following rates, which in the opinion of the Trust would cover the normally expected period of useful life of each of the category of assets on written down value method:

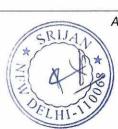

9) Investments in Fixed deposit are held at cost.

10) Employees benefits:

The Trust has been providing following benefits to its employees as per the term of employment with them namely:





- a. Provident Fund: The Trust has been discharging its liabilities along with amount deducted from the employees to the Regional Provident Fund Commissioner, as per the provisions of the Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952, on a monthly basis.
- b. Gratuity: The Trust has been providing its liability towards Group Gratuity Scheme of its employees through funds invested with Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) on accrual basis, based on actuarial valuation and in compliance with Accounting Standard 15 (Revised) employee benefit.
- c. Staff Insurance: The Trust has been providing group accidental insurance and medical insurance benefits to its employees through sum assured with the insurance company-Care Health Insurance Limited

11) Promotion, support and maintenance of Community Based Institutions (CBI's):

- a. In order to achieve its objectives and donor and Government mandates in promotion of rural development and livelihood promotion activities in the areas of operations and targeted beneficiaries, often based on the mandate and directions, the Trust encourages the beneficiaries to organise themselves into community based institutions in the form of Co-operatives, Producer Companies or Societies, as necessary, to support and sustain their operations during and even beyond the period of project as initiated and supported by the Trust. These Community institutions are initially managed and nurtured by the Trust, with an ultimate intent to hand over the governance and management to the community or the members of the institutions, by infusing capacity to manage the same. Until such time, these institutions are supported by the grants & contributions, internal resources and the resources generated by the community itself and SRIJAN acts as a Trustee for the same, moving towards the goal of creating sustainable, independent institutions.
- b. Though independent books of accounts are maintained for the financial transactions for each of such institutions, separate governance structure is in existence; wherever needed, however independent audit by them.
- c. The Trust has institutionalized appropriate control systems commensurate to the nature, size and reach of operations of these initiatives. The internal control framework has been well defined in the Finance manual approved by the Board.
- d. As on March 31, 2023, there are three registered institutions, in the form of producer companies, in which technical expertise and professional guidance is provided by the Trust. The details the registered institutions are as follows:
 - 1. Shipre Farmers' Producer Company Limited-Shivpuri
 - 2. Sahan Shakti Farmers' Producer Company Limited-Baran
 - 3. Ken Betwa Mahila Farmer Producer Company Limited-Tikamgarh





11) Allocation of Salary, allowances, and other benefits to various projects / programs / activities:

The salary, allowances and staff benefits are allocated as per the Common costs allocation policy of the organisation in accordance with the terms and conditions of grants /MOU's/budgets available as approved by the CEO and confirmed by the Governing Board.

B. NOTES TO ACCOUNTS:

- 1. **CONTINGENT LIABILITIES:** Bank Guarantees (3 in No's) amounting to Rs.21 lakhs (Previous Year Rs. 21 lakhs) have been provided against the pledge of FDRs value Rs. 21 lakhs for timely execution of projects. Though the validity of these BGs have been expired in the year 2020, however, the same are yet to be released by the respective departments.
- 2. Livelihood Promotion Activities: Rs. 21,06,44,004/- (Previous year Rs. 22,00,99,653/-) this includes:
 - **a.** Rs.75,91,097/- (Previous year Rs. 1,20,92,218/-) spent on the formation and strengthening of SHG Federations managed by the communities.
 - **b.** No amount has been incurred during the year 2022-23 (Previous year Rs. Nil) through Capital assets grant to the community.
 - c. Rs.15,77,06,508/- (Previous year Rs. 18,40,80,269/-) directly spent by the Trust in execution of various rural development and livelihood promotion enterprises / projects under the mandate of various Government and Philanthropic institutions.
 - d. Rs. 3,15,59,921 (Previous year Rs. 2,07,16,025) directly spent by the Trust in relation to the services provided by Community Mobilizers and Village Resource Persons in execution of various rural development and livelihood promotion enterprises / projects under the mandate of various Government and Philanthropic institutions.
 - e. Rs. 1,37,86,479 (Previous year Rs. 32,11,141) spent by the trust towards training and workshops for rural development and livelihood promotion activities.

- a) The grant amount have been utilized on the basis of Expenditure Statements submitted by implementing NGO's/Audited Utilization Certificates of other independent firm of Chartered Accounts. However, audited UCs (2 No's) in respect of Rs. 7.89 lakhs out of total utilization Rs. 675.80 lakhs have not been received as on date.
- b) Unspent balance of Rs. 130.63 lakhs as on 31-03-2023 which includes Rs. 29 lakhs and Rs. 1.5 lakhs are pending prior to 01-04-2022 from Education for Employability Foundation (Related Party) and Gramshree foundation respectively for which neither utilization nor amount refunded by these NGOs.

4. Grants & Specific Donation

- a) The Trust has received total grants & donations of Rs. 5571.08 lakhs (including Rs. 2145.95 lakhs as foreign contribution) during the F.Y. 2022-23 (*Previous Year Rs.* 4052.68 lakhs including Rs. 1607.11 lakhs as foreign contribution).
- b) In some grants where utilisation certificates received during 2022-23, there are differences of Rs. 97,446 between the UCs and the expenditure booked, which are not material, are under reconciliation/adjustments etc.
- c) Overspent amount on the project recoverable is Rs. 169.19 lakhs as on 31-03-2023; of which Rs. 159.38 lakhs and Rs. 7.54 lakhs are outstanding for more than 2 years from Govt of MP MG NREGS CFT & Govt. of Uttar Pradesh SRLM- CFP UP respectively. In the opinion of the Management of Srijan, these balances are good for recovery and no provision is required.
- d) Unspent balances is Rs.2885.97 lakhs as on 31-03-2023 in the restricted project fund, of which Rs. 384.49 lakhs are lying in the undernoted 6 no. of grants (LC/FC) even though their project period were completed for which extension are required to be received as on date-

- e) As per FCRA Amendment Act, 2020, no fund was remitted to the NGO Partners w.e.f 28th Sept 2020 by Srijan. Ongoing Projects were terminated vide letter dated 21st Feb 2021 issued to NGO Partners and the unspent Grant balances as per Utilization certificates Rs. 0.51 lakhs and Rs. 0.66 lakhs from BSS & Arunodaya respectively is not recoverable and have been written off during the current year after taking approval from Board of the Trustees of Srijan.
- f) Underspent of grant balance of Rs. 856,161 have been written back, as income and overspent of grants balances of Rs. 169,588 being unrecoverable, have been written off, as expenditure during the year.

5. Gratuity:

The SRIJAN operates a gratuity plan where every employee is entitled to benefits equivalent to fifteen days' salary for every year of completed service with the Company, calculated based on 26 days a month on the last total fixed compensation drawn immediately preceding the date when the employee becomes entitled for gratuity under the Scheme. The same is payable at the time of separation from the Company or retirement, whichever is earlier. The benefits vest after one year of continuous service.
